edges, snow flakes, afghans and more.




Jenara Han In Cros Eas the Easy Way

The hook has an extended shaft of uniform thickness from the handle. This shaft holds the thread like a tatting needle. Change between Cro-Tatting and crochet all in the one article using the same hook and still achieve the delicate look of tatting.


All Cro-Tatting books have clear pictures and

instructions of this method used.

The Cro-Tat master hook was designed with the wool crocheters in mind. This hook features marks of 4" increments on the shaft of the hook to measure your picots as you stitch.


# Musterpiece of the Manth

# Crochet Challenge

prefer to make clothes, so I am pleased that ponchos are back in fashion. Now I am going to experiment with one for my baby granddaughter who is 18 mths old. I will use the 4 Hour Ponchos & Caps pattern and thinner wool."


KIM S - WALLSEND, NSW has sent us her crochet challenge. Kim suggests that you can use cross stitch patterns to create picture crochet. Work using Double Crochet or use Tricot (afghan) stitch to crochet the cross stitch pattern into a plain background. When complete, if needed, outline pattern with backstitch. Completed pictures can be used to personalise baby jumpers or rugs etc, or picture squares can be joined together to create a personalised blanket. With a bit of practice and varying degrees of patience, more colours can be added to achieve more complicated designs.



ROD B - TEMPE, NSW has used our new **Oren Bayan #8 Perle Cotton** in his Japanese Kumihimo Braids. Rod hopes to use the cotton in an upcoming International Braid Swap!

"I finally found a pattern for a rectangle that is crocheted in the round and am making (for me) a knee rug. Square knee rugs don't make sense to me as I want to cover from my waist to my toes and that is a rectangle in anyone's book! The original pattern was for an eight pointed placemat, I just eliminated that

extra row that split the corners. I also changed the yarn and the hook. Who needs specific patterns! I also made an extra large granny square for my niece and I used and edge pattern out of a Myart Edge Book to give it a patterned edge. The edge was in 8ply acrylic and was massive, about 20cm wide, but it

#### EXPLANATION OF AMERICAN YARNS

The availability of American crochet patterns provides you with the opportunity to explore your craft by using a greater variety of patterns and techniques than are generally provided by English terminology patterns. We get a lot of inquiries about American yarn sizes, so we have put together the following guidelines.

#### Threads / Yarns

American threads usually use the same sizing as our own for crochet cotton sizes such as our number 10, 20, 40, etc. shown as No 10 or #10 etc. Bedspread weight yarn generally refers to our No 10 crochet cotton but some patterns may use thicker yarn such as No 5 or even our 4 ply cotton, so check hook and tension specified.

Yarn sizes however are generally provided as a weight of yarn such as worsted weight, sports weight, etc. The following provides: a very basic guide for determining the yarn to use and should be used in conjunction with any specified hook size and tension.

When using an American pattern that requires worsted weight yarn and you want to use 8ply yarn and a 4.00mm hook, remember the article will probably turn out smaller, so from the tension, add more

> stitches / rows to achieve the required size.

#### Embroidery Threads

Cotton perle (pearl) embroidery threads, although generally softer and more shiny than crochet cotton, may be used in crochet patterns as follows:- #5 perle is a little thicker than #10 crochet cotton but is suitable for most #10 cotton. patterns; #8 perle is about the same as #20 crochet cotton and #12 perle is about the same as #40 crochet cotton.
