PRODUCT OF THE MONTH

CANDLEWICKING

Candlewicking is a form of surface embroidery that originated from Colonial America over 200 years ago. It gets its name because the embroidery was created with a running stitch from an unwaxed thread (used for candle wicks) in order to achieve a raised or embossed look. Motifs are made using a variety of knots and satin stitches. Sometimes stitches are cut - a method called "tufting", this creates a chenille like

Fabric - Traditionally Candlewicking is worked on 100% cotton unbleached calico. This dates back to when women often would use the calico from flour bags and the cotton from the seams as thread. However candlewickers of modern times also use homespun and even linen fabrics.

Threads - Embroidery threads in colonial times were very difficult to come by and somewhat expensive, so until coloured threads became cheaper and more obtainable, white and cream were the colours most used. Candlewicking thread is available in white, cream and some colours. Perle Crochet Cotton #8 and #12 can also be used and are available in a range of colours. Some even use 4ply cotton. Threads differ in thickness and texture; most people use 1 to 6 strands of thread to suit different stitches and the desired effect you wish to achieve.

Needles - A number 6 crewel needle is generally used for Candlewicking. The larger sizes 4 and 5 are used when working thicker threads.

Designs - Here at Crochet Australia we have many designs in Book Collections from Anne Green and Jean Jensen ranging from nature and flowers, to teddy bears and scarecrows. We also stock a range of Bella Traced Linen pieces that are can be adapted to Candlewicking as well as tracing patterns for

crinoline ladies and old houses.



Don't ever be afraid to experiment with fabrics, designs, threads and colours, remember that it may become a treasured heirloom created by you, so the result will be well worth it!






