elcome to the June 2007 newsletter!!






PRODUCT OF THE MONTH

FABRIC SHAPES

To our surprise the hottest items at the moment are the new linen shapes. Both the tatters and the crocheters alike have purchased these shapes which can be used as a single doily or joined to form larger articles, such as runners or cloths. Just add an edge and hey presto, you have a family heirloom. Nothing could be easier. Our fabric shapes are of good quality cotton, finished with spoked edges, so you could even cheat a little and add lace.

We are now expecting our third shipment of these little beauties. Not all shapes come in every colour but we buy what is available at time of shipment. With each shipment we have increased the range of shapes so that we now have the following while the current stocks last.



Round - white, green and natural Octagon - white, dk red and navy

Diamond - white and cream Heart - white

Oval - white and natural Clover - white Triangle - white Petal - white and It green

Lotus - white, yellow, blue, cream, rose pink and apricot. Square - white, blue, apricot, green and yellow.



Our Spanish MYM books (symbol crochet) on edges, especially books PUNTI18 and PUNTI19 have ideas for square corners and rounds. \$11.95 each. PUNTIO3, PUNTIO9 and PUNTI10 also have suitable corners for the squares.

Vicki has put together a couple of edges, practising on the lotus, round and octagonal. When you order these shapes ask for a free copy. Hopefully in haste the words will make good sense. Perhaps you may like to share your ideas with others as we all play with these fun shapes. Who knows what we may achieve. We also have some give away books if you order 10 or more shapes, just mention this newsletter article when ordering to receive your free book!

No matter what size thread you choose to use for your edge, we can help you with Sizes #5 to #100. Vicki used #20 for hers, but it really is personal choice.

So come on, join in the fun and have a go. Try something different. You will be pleasantly surprised at how easy they really are.



Built in 1896, the house still has the kauri panels along the walls. The spread fits into this environment superbly.

This is a rug I crocheted quite a few years ago. It is all done in double crochet. Sewing in the ends has always been a real pain Knits for Kids.




Thankyou for sending the patterns I am

the *Pillow Dolls*.



The babies jackets are from BK19 Crocheted Matinee Jackets




