PRODUCT OF THE MONTH

ELIZABETH HIDDLESON BOOKS AND PATTERNS You may recall that we featured this author some time back. These Vintage patterns and leaflets are worth another look as we may not be able to get them for much longer. Elizabeth Hiddleson was an

American crochet pattern designer from the early 1950's. Some of her patterns have featured in Crochet Magazines as well. Her patterns have written instructions and very good sharp black and white photographs, which make them easy to follow. Also very good for those people who do not read patterns but prefer to work from the picture.

There are 35 books and 47 pattern packs to choose from. All but one of these Edition (EH1A baby & girls clothes) are for doilies, tablecloths, runners and chair backs. These books and patterns are for all thread crocheters, and no matter what size thread you prefer, just choose the design of choice, and use the thread and hook to suit. Elizabeth loved pineapple and spider web designs. Her designs are diversified to include rounds, ovals, edges, tablecloths, filet and more.

Please note that these books are old (not second hand) and have been in storage in America for some time so there may be rusty staples, discoloured pages, but the books are new. So if you want easy designs with a touch of class, don't go past these. They may be from another era, but they certainly complement modern décor.

Pattern packs of 5 patterns are \$7.50 and books are only \$10.00ea. We have a special this month which allows you to get a free pattern pack. See page 4 for details.






postage! You going to that warehouse was definitely fate. It's a lovely book, thanks. Janet C of Kelso NSW


Ed note: This book has been out of print for a long time now and we managed to pick up some copies when visiting a warehouse on a recent "day off".



Handy Hint from Colleen G Murwillumbah NSW

Readers may like to know, when making an item in pure wool that needs small quantities of contrast colours, instead of buying and then wasting a large ball of yarn, simply buy tapestry yarn. This wool comes in 100's of colours and is great if you need a colour you are not likely to use again for another project. The same goes for thread crochet, if I need a small contrast amount I use stranded cotton, starting with 1 strand with #20 thread and 6 strands with 4 ply cotton.

I would like to thank you so much for your efficient and fast service, I received my Liteflex needles today and they are just




perfect. I will certainly be ordering from you again, thank you also for the newsletter it is great reading. **Denise M of Nambour QLD**
