

Also pictured are her Sailors in their beaded suits from the pattern TTDSSS Sailor Suit for 6" doll (\$8.75)






Handy Hints



This lovely doily was made by Mary R of Logan Central Qld using Klasik #30 crochet cotton from a pattern in Crochet Monthly No 300.




