reliable supply of your favourite things. We are pleased that the Almina/Myra has been a real hit with lots of reorders confirming we must have got it right.



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## MOTIFS

Making motifs is an interesting concept, as most of

us when learning to crochet, incorporated the most popular motif, the Granny square as part of the beginner's regime. These days we see motifs in many shapes and sizes. Squares, circles, triangles, octagon, hexagon, flowers,



hearts, butterflies, pictured squares and now with the popularity of freeform crochet you can have any motif your crochet hook produces as the rules have been put aside in the name of art. Combine this with lots of colour and the memories of the humble motif being white or cream and being in the form of a doily are far removed.



Lately we have seen the daisy wheel and the butterfly looms that make daisies both round and square, the hairpin staples that make

strip motifs, the knit wonder that makes circular strips, and yes you can also add the knitted motifs that are usually blocks of all over designs and tatted motifs. The combination of these are used to produce afghan rugs, pillows, hats, scarves, bags, garments, doilies, tablecloths and runners, tea towel tops and more.

## Fandy Hints

From PB1649 (See Book of the month on Page 8):

Motif sizes.

The size of the hook used is one factor in controlling the size of the motif, the other is how you hold your yarn. If your motif is too big either use a smaller hook or wrap the yarn 2 or more times around the middle finger when tensioning the yarn to release it more slowly. If your motif is too small either use a larger hook or allow the yarn to slip more freely through the fingers.


Patterns for the butterfly and Crinoline lady are available from a New Idea magazine (1983).




