
Babies

Handy Hints

Secure tails diagonally.

From the book Crochet in Colour by Kathy Merrick - Taller stitches (such as treble and quad crochet) and lacy motifs do not hide ends as well as denser fabrics do, so securing tails diagonally works better than trying to crochet them. Use a smaller hook and pull the tails through a few inches of loops on the back of the work.

Lana D from Auchenflower QLD learnt to crochet when she lived in Russia. This is one of her many talents, but crocheting to her is like breathing to us. Her daughter Nataly D who refers to mum as a crochet machine, totally overwhelmed us with mums stash of bed spreads, doilies and runners. This was just a sample as Mum had given most of it away to the rellies. There were 65 pieces all told and these we worked in #10 and #20 crochet cotton, all without patterns to follow. Lana does not understand our written patterns. Each piece was as perfect as the first and she tells me that when she runs out of cotton, she unpulls a piece and works another.

5 MINUTE CHOCOLATE MUG CAKE

2 tablespoons flour, 2 tablespoons sugar, 2 teaspoons cocoa, 1 egg, 2 tablespoons milk, 1 tablespoon oil, 3 tablespoons chocolate chips (optional), a small splash of vanilla extract, 1 large coffee mug.

Add dry ingredients to mug, and mix well. Add the egg and mix thoroughly. Pour in the milk and oil and mix well. Add the chocolate chips (if using) and vanilla extract, and mix again. Put your mug in the microwave and cook for 3 minutes at 1000 watts (high). The cake will rise over the top of the mug, but don't be alarmed! Allow to cool a little, and tip out onto a plate and add ice-cream if desired. (Yuuuummmmmmmmm!!)

We have discontinued Zirayon which is being cleared at a great price - premixed packet of 9 colours for only \$20 - that's a whopping saving of \$11.50 over the regular price - but be quick as we only have limited stock.

I would like to wholeheartedly agree with your customer Eleanor G from Canada. The most predominant yarns found in the shops are the ecru and white, colours are very limited and very hard to get all the yarn one needs in the same dyelot even if it is white, not to mention the fact that service is non-existent. When I was looking for the pink to make the roses for the Cameo dress I could not find the right colour, and it was extremely expensive. Thought you might like to know that the DMC yarn in white is being sold in Sydney at Spotlight for \$8.95 per ball and there was only about four balls in the tray. I love your website and am extremely happy that I found it, it has inspired me to continue my hobby which I had neglected for 20 odd years, for a crocheter it is like being in a Candy shop, I have never seen so much variety in my life, the books, the thread and yarns and all the other bits and pieces you stock and most important the service you provide. **Rita C of Wetherill Park NSW**


