## PRODUCT OF THE MONTH

### Knitting

From Wikipedia, we are told that knitting is a method by which thread or yarn may be turned into cloth or other fine crafts. Knitting consists of consecutive loops, called

stitches. As each row progresses, a new loop is pulled through an existing loop. The active stitches are held on a needle until another loop can be passed through them. This process eventually results in a final product, often a garment.



Like crocheting, knitting has always been a popular pastime and most of us learnt to knit at an early age. Alas if you have never taken up the challenge, there are lots of great ideas and patterns that you are missing out on. Tricot and crochetnit, although not knitting, produce a similar style of fabric as this technique has knit and purl rows worked with a long crochet hook. There has been a lot of interest of late in both of these, as it is seen as a new craft even though they have been around since knitting began.

Here at Cro Aus we have mainly concentrated on baby knitting, afghan rugs, childrens clothing, toys and novelty articles that are available. We do however have great knitting needles with arthritic properties. We are always receiving rave reviews over the Liteflex range and the Boye circular knitters in sets have always been a favourite of the lace knitters. If knitting needles seem a lot of effort to you, alas we have the Prym knitting machine available, and you will be able to whiz up those endless pieces of plain knitting in no time at all.

Most of our cottons ranging from the finer #100 to the thicker #5 are suitable for lace knitting and the thicker 4ply and 8plys are wonderful for clothing, shawls, rugs etc all year round. Our 8ply Dazzle acrylic in the 100g balls and Peterpan baby yarns in 2, 3, 4 and 8ply in 50g seem to be popular no matter what the season. With bead knitting for dolls and purses or knitting miniatures being of interest to some, the perle #8 in both DMC and the Turkish thread Oran Beyan are available and there are 100s of colours to choose from. Yes some very tiny knitting needles used here and of course we stock them as well.



Colour charts are available for all our threads and yarn. Please ask if you need them and we are happy to post them off with your orders.




Lexi B, Tenterfield NSW tells us that that her niece needed some


Just had a quiet moment to sit down and open your parcel. Thank you for the pressie of the wool. I didn't realize that you stocked
