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Theme of the Month—Amigurumi

Amigurumi - a Japanese word that translates as 'dolls that are knitted or crocheted'. But the word 'doll' isn't limited to the traditional girls toy. It is much broader and encompasses all stuffed toys such as animals, food, plants, people, monsters,



and the list goes on. Something to bring some joy and playfulness to babies, children and adults alike!

What's more, they can come in a variety of sizes - from the miniature which make excellent key rings or tags - to the huggable for babies and children - to larger items that add a decorative touch to any room.

They make excellent textured baby gifts. And many of the new designs come with detachable or changeable parts, bringing some creativity to child's play - such as the amamani puzzle balls, and stack-em up toys.

Many of the recent books have begun taking Amigurumi to a new level with many whimsical creatures, realistic animals and fantastical creations. They are certainly a way to explore the creative side of our craft.

All make great ideas for gifts for any occasion. With Christmas just around the corner - they are the perfect fun gift to make for the young. You don't need many tools, and it doesn't matter if they are not exact. Use smaller hooks than normal so that the fabric is tighter allowing you to stuff them without it all falling out! Finding the filler to stuff the toys can be hard - but there are several options available - buy a cheap pillow and take out the stuffing; if

you are a sewer or know one, collect the off-cuts and use these, combined with other fillers - this will also add some weight if you need it; if you want to make it heavy for a doorstop try sewing a calico lining or using a balloon with rice and birdseed or sand to add weight.

Tip of the Month



The Invisible Decrease


Do you get frustrated with the holes that appear in your projects where you have decreased stitches? I came across this technique which is commonly used in Amigurumi construction - as you cannot have holes for the stuffing to fall out - and have successfully used it in other projects - The Invisible Double Crochet Decrease.

To make this decrease, insert your hook under the first loop of the next stitch, and pull your hook forward to give it a little bit of stretch. Then insert your hook under the first loop of the following stitch. Complete your double crochet as normal. (I have also seen some designers vary this by inserting their hook under both loops of the second stitch.) I personally like using the first loop of both stitches.

Things to watch for when using this technique:

- 1. This is great working in rounds where you don't turn your work. If you are turning you work try to keep the decreases on the front side of your work.
- 2. Keep an eye on your tension as it is very easy to create loose 'vs' around your decrease. Here are some pictures of good 'checkpoints' for your decrease.
 - a) After putting your hook through the first loop of the two stitches, pull the yarn to tighten the loop on your hook before putting the yarn

around the hook - this will ensure your 'v' for the stitch is not loose.





b) When you have completed the decrease, but before beginning the next stitch, pull your stitch forward so that it is straight and in the position you want it to be. This will stop the 'v' of the next stitch loosening up.
